# JOINT URGENT MOTION OF COMMONWEALTH AGENT AND COFINA AGENT REQUESTING THAT COURT HOLD DECISION ON MOTIONS FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT IN ABEYANCE FOR 60-DAY PERIOD

To The Honorable United States District Court Judge Laura Taylor Swain:

- 1. The Commonwealth Agent<sup>2</sup> and the COFINA Agent respectfully submit this joint urgent motion requesting that the Court hold its decision on the motions for summary judgment (the "Motions for Summary Judgment") filed in the above-captioned adversary proceeding in abeyance for a period of 60 days.
- 2. The Commonwealth Agent and COFINA Agent have reached an agreement in principle to settle the Commonwealth-COFINA Dispute and those related issues that may be mediated pursuant to the order expanding the scope of the Agents' mediation authority.<sup>3</sup> The details of the agreement in principle will be provided to the advisors to parties participating in the mediation (subject to the mediation privilege and other restrictions of the mediation process). Although the Agents have reached an agreement in principle, holders of claims that would be affected by a settlement should be aware that there are various conditions precedent and subsequent that may prevent the settlement from ever becoming effective.

All capitalized terms used but not defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed to such terms in the Stipulation and Order Approving Procedures to Resolve Commonwealth-COFINA Dispute [Dkt. No. 996] (the "Stipulation").

Order Granting Joint Urgent Motion of the Financial Oversight and Management Board for Puerto Rico, the Commonwealth Agent, and the COFINA Agent for an Order Expanding for Mediation Purposes Only Authority and Immunity Protections [Adv. Pro. No. 17-257, Dkt. No. 284].

3. The Agents file this motion to inform the Court of this agreement in principle, and to jointly request that the Court not rule on the Motions for Summary Judgment for a period of 60 days from the date hereof (<u>i.e.</u>, August 4, 2018). This will provide the Agents with time to ensure that the conditions precedent to the agreement in principle are satisfied.

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WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, the Agents jointly request that the Court enter the proposed order attached hereto as <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a>, granting the relief requested herein and granting any other relief as is just and proper.
